Drive Safely this Easter

Four people have died on NSW roads this morning and Ambulance officers are appealing to motorists to slow down and take care on the roads in the run up to the Easter holidays.

Accidents in Georges Hall in Sydney, Woolgoolga and Yass claimed four lives and have put three people in hospital with serious injuries.

Ambulance officer Neil Hargreaves provided the following tips for motorists planning road trips this Easter:

- Get a good night's sleep before commencing a long trip.
- Do not drive at times when you would normally be asleep.
- Avoid long drives after work.
- Take regular breaks from driving.
- Share the driving whenever possible.
