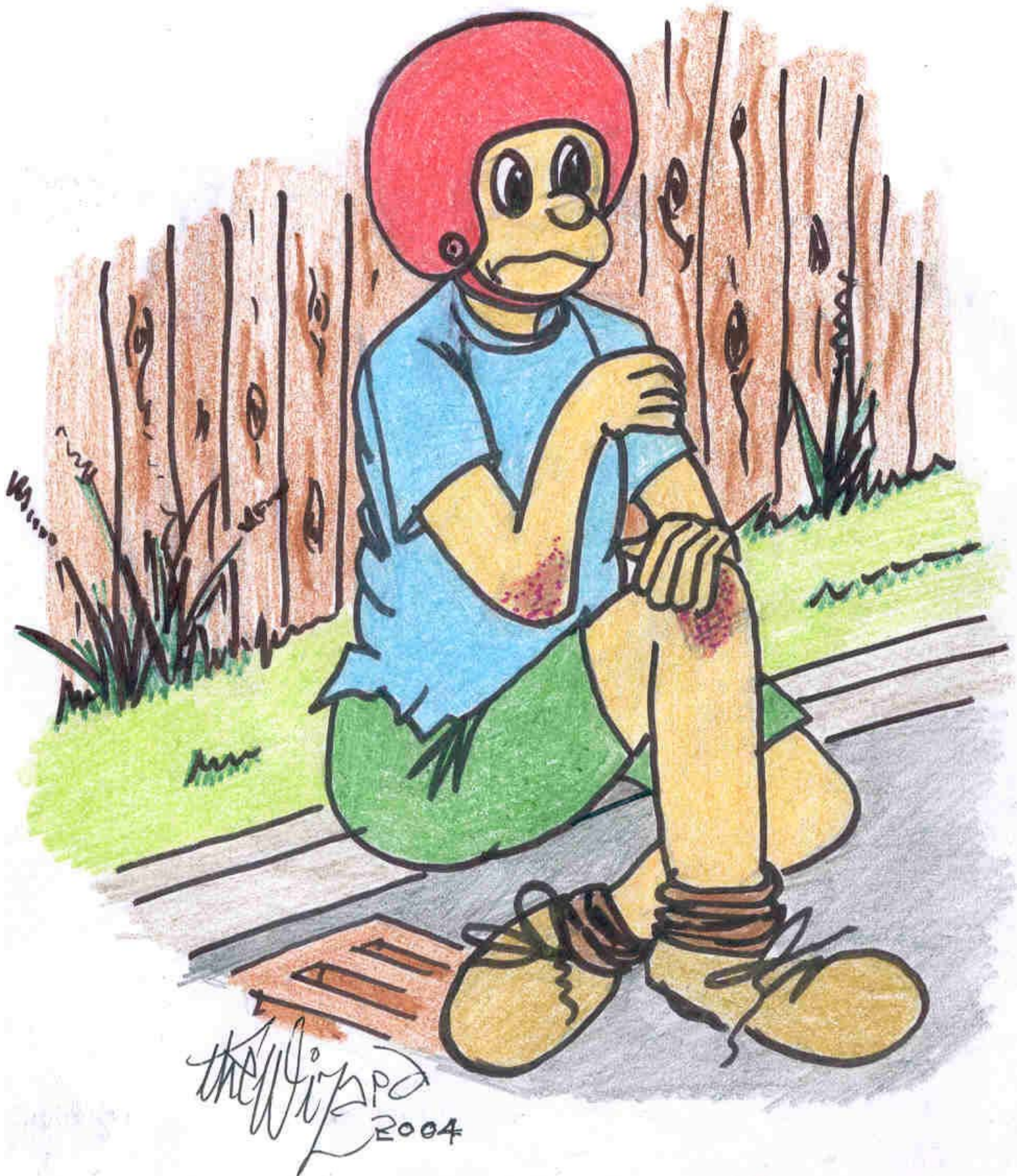
Be an Ambulance Hero:

A: If Julie only has a small cut on her finger and there is just a little blood, this might be a small accident. Ask a parent, grown-up or teacher for help.



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**Q: Mike was going too fast
on his bike and fell off.
He has hurt his arm.
Is this a little accident or a
big accident?**

**A: If Mike can talk and he
only has a small graze on his
arm, this is a small accident.
Ask a parent, grown-up or
teacher for help.**



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**Q: Jimmy has fallen out
of a tree and says that he
cannot move.**

**Is this a little accident
or a big accident?**

**A: If a person says that
they cannot move this is
a big accident.**

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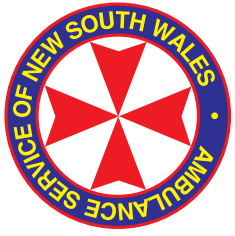
Q: Peter does not know what is wrong with his dad. He is holding his chest and is having trouble breathing. He can not talk. Is this a little accident or a big accident?

A: If a person has chest pain or is having trouble breathing this is a big accident. Dial Zero Zero Zero



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**Q: Jessica found her uncle lying on the ground.
She tried to wake him up but he is not moving.**

**A: If a person will not wake up when you shout
their name and squeeze their shoulders
this is a big accident.
