- An incident is a single call for ambulance assistance.
- Priority 1 incidents are those requiring an immediate response with the closest and most timely ambulance resource. Ambulance vehicles are required to travel with lights and siren.
- Priority 2 incidents are those requiring an immediate response with the most timely ambulance resource or a response within a set timeframe. Ambulance vehicles operate within normal road rules.
- NSW Ambulance emergency response time is the period between when a Triple Zero (000) emergency call is recorded in the dispatch queue and the time the first ambulance resource arrives at the scene.
